

observe November 11<sup>th</sup> as Veterans Day:

### **History of Veterans Day**

World War I – known at the time as "The Great War" - officially ended when the Treaty of Versailles was signed on June 28, 1919, in the Palace of Versailles outside the town of Versailles, France. However, fighting ceased seven months earlier when an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, between the Allied nations and Germany went into effect on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. For that reason, November 11, 1918, is generally regarded as the end of "the war to end all wars."

In November 1919, President Wilson proclaimed November 11 as the first commemoration of Armistice Day with the following words: "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations..."

The original concept for the celebration was for a day observed with parades and public meetings and a brief suspension of business beginning at 11:00 a.m.

And for any of you who have thought of becoming an MFA instructor, which Michigan is in some need of, training now will be mostly Web based. In Michigan, Ohio, and Indiana, there are four MFA Instructor Trainers who are updating their training to continue being MFA Instructor Trainers. At the current time, you would have to attend a one day class of approximately six hours with one of those four. This would be after completing online training and an online test. There is a fee to become an MFA Instructor of \$170.00. Michigan would be willing to pick up that expense if you would like to volunteer to become a new MFA Instructor.

If you are currently an MFA instructor, this does not affect you until your renewal date, and the cost for renewals has not changed. And, of course, Michigan picks up that expense also.

It is not exactly accurate to say that the Motorist Awareness Program is new to Michigan or even GWRRA. It has been a part of the Rider Education Program up until now. Along with other changes being made within the structure of our Association, Motorist Awareness has split away from Rider Education. These two programs may now concentrate on their uniqueness and their similarities for all of us and the general public.

While Rider Education teaches riders and coriders how to ride safely and what to do in an emergency, Motorist Awareness teaches other motorists and their passengers to be aware that motorcycles share the road with them. It is not just a saying, but a reality. The responsibility for helping all motorist to understand and be aware that motorcycles are on the road should be a part of every rider and co-rider's day. Basically everyone who rides also drives other vehicles.
