

As we enter into 2018, we're thinking of new things for the new year. One of those things should be your new, or renewing, of your Medic First Aid and CPR status. Keeping your knowledge and these abilities fresh may save a life someday.

Chapter Directors, you may request a MFA/CPR class by going to the Michigan District website, go to Programs, click on Rider Education, and scroll down to Request Medic First Aid. You will need to have three date choices and how many will be taking the class. This is needed as one instructor may only have 12 students, maximum 24 students with two instructors. You will also need to know where the class will be held, and complete contact information. A check for \$25 per person made out to GWRRA District-MI will need to be sent in at least two weeks prior to the class. Having a plan for lunch before your class is held is a good idea, too. Thank you to all those who plan to 'feed your volunteer instructor,' although it is not required.

Early in the year is a great time to schedule as it will not take away any riding time. A reminder that it is first come, first serve, on class dates as we only have a few volunteer instructors to handle the state.

Motorist Awareness Program...

I'm hoping you all had a good Thanksgiving. We all have lots to be thankful for, like a safe riding season.

Chapter Directors, I hope you have asked a fun, outgoing, safety-minded member to join your Team as the Chapter Motorist Awareness Coordinator. This position is important to everyone who rides a motorcycle, drives any vehicle or is a passenger.

By improving the Motorist Awareness Program, (MAP), we can make it safer for everyone who rides a motorcycle. One main improvement is being able to present one of the new, short programs that will soon be available on the District website. These presentations can be done within the Chapter, but even more importantly, at other events where many different drivers may be targeted with the information.

The December issue of Wing World contains an article by Mike and Barri Critzman, Directors of the Motorist Awareness Program, about 10 Talking Points to use to open up discussions. Here are their 10 points.

1. Over half of all motorcycle fatal crashes involved another vehicle. Most of the time the motorcyclist is not at fault. Drivers often ignore motorcycles (usually unintentionally).
2. Because of its narrow profile, a motorcycle can easily be hidden in a car's blind spot, or masked by objects or backgrounds outside a car.
3. Because of its small size, a motorcycle may look farther away than it is.
4. Motorcycles often slow down by downshifting or rolling off the throttle, thus not activating the brake light. Allow at least three or four seconds of following distance.
5. Motorcyclists often adjust lane position to avoid debris, minimize the effects of wind, and to pass other vehicles. They are not moving around the lane to show off.
6. Turn signals on many motorcycles are not self-canceling. Some times riders forget to turn them off. Make sure the signal is for real.
7. Although a motorcycle is better at maneuvering, don't expect a motorcyclist to always be able to dodge out of the way.
8. Allow more following distance behind a motorcycle.
9. See the person under the helmet who could be your friend, neighbor or relative.
10. If a driver crashes into a motorcyclist, bicyclist, or pedestrian and causes serious injury, the driver would likely never forgive himself/herself.

I hope you use the above tips whenever you talk about motorcycles.
