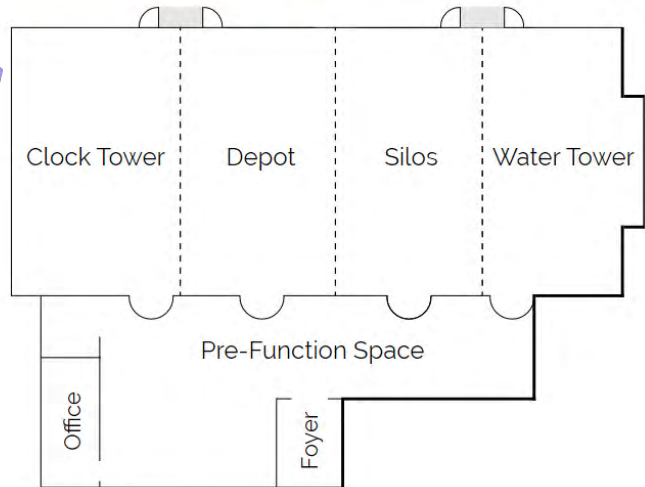

I hope everyone is planning on attending Wingless Weekend. Do you have your registration and reservations made yet? Need to hurry and the rooms have been reduced. It sounds like a lot of fun is waiting for all of us. Where else can you have rider ed., Leadership training and membership enhancement seminars, games, an escape room, vendors, entertainment (of one form or another) and lots of fun with friends all in a single weekend? Come join us for 70's Flower Power and get your Groove On!

Have you ever felt like your job was trying to kill you? Well do I have a story for you, one-night last spring while I was at work I started to feel ran down and had symptoms of a head cold or just really bad allergies. I had a headache that just wouldn't quit and seemed to get worse as the night went on. The longer I was there the worse I felt. I had the window in our office opened as our office is over the boiler and it was really hot in there even though it was only 47 degrees outside. There were only three people working that night in the building, I was located in our 2nd floor office and the other two people were working on the 5th floor.

Down stairs in the hallway there was an alarm going off, it just sent out a quiet beeped every 20-30 seconds, nothing that would make you think it was something urgent. It had nothing to do with my equipment so I didn't really pay attention to it and it didn't intensify in volume so I didn't think it was a safety alarm. Alarms of one sort or another are going off in our building on a regular basis and we share the building with another group so I just assumed that it had something to do with their equipment.

After about half an hour of the alarm beeping there was a loud knocking at the office door. I answered it only to have one of the other workers ask how long the alarm had been going off and to make sure I was alright. It kind of puzzled me why he would ask if I was alright, but I told him I was O.K., other then feeling kind of sick. About 5 minutes later I was told that we were evacuating the building.

It seems that the alarm was the carbon monoxide alarm and the only place the alarm is located is on the first floor of the building, so if you are working on the top floor, the building can fill up with carbon monoxide and you wouldn't know it, since the alarm was not that noticeable from the second floor, you wouldn't be able to hear it at all from the 5th.

The fire department was called along with the gas company. The supervisor for the other group came over to the building. It seems that a vent on the boiler was not working properly and was allowing the fumes to remain in the building. So, the boiler was turned off to prevent it from continuing to expel carbon monoxide, the building was aired out and declared safe to reenter about 90 minutes later. During that time, I just sat out in the parking lot waiting. It was amazing how much better I started to feel in the fresh air.

It was a good thing that I had our office window open that night. Otherwise I may have been in much worse shape. In the future if I hear an alarm going off downstairs, I will check it out to make sure that work is not trying to kill me.

This experience made me wonder how many times in our riding life we ignore alarms. I am talking about the silent alarms that go off in our heads. Like when we get too close to the center line in a corner, or think maybe we shouldn't try to pass the vehicle in front of us, or we see a car approaching an intersection that we are coming up to and instead of taking action we just let it go and assume that all will go well. We need to make sure that we are riding or driving smart and pay attention to all those little silent alarms that go off. No one else will do it for us.

So maybe now is the time to take action and attend a few extra seminars at Wingless or another winter event. You could also arrange for one or more at your chapter. Brushing up on your CPR/First aid skills would be a good idea too. How about signing up for a Riders course, even if you participated in one in the past year or two you don't have to wait 3 years and you can never be too prepared.
