# District Educators

Fall is in,

Watch for the animals and watch for the farmers! Take your time, save a life.

Remember to follow traffic rules. Obey the speed limit; the faster you go the longer it will take you to stop. Experienced riders know local traffic laws - and they don't take risks. Obey traffic lights, signs, speed limits, and lane markings. Leave plenty of room between your bike and other vehicles, and always check behind you and signal before you change lanes. Remember to ride defensively. The majority of multi-vehicle motorcycle crashes are caused when other drivers simply didn't see the motorcyclist. Proceed cautiously at intersections and yield to pedestrians and other vehicles as appropriate. You can increase your visibility by applying reflective materials to your motorcycle and by keeping your motorcycle's headlights on at all times.

Alcohol and drugs, including some prescribed medications, negatively affect your judgment, coordination, balance, throttle control, and ability to shift gears. These substances also impair your alertness and reduce your reaction time. Even when you're fully alert, it's impossible to predict what other vehicles or pedestrians are going to do. Therefore, make sure you are alcohol and drug free when you get on your motorcycle. Otherwise, you'll be heading for trouble.

As a motorcyclist, you need to pay attention to the road you are riding on. Always be more cautious when going into curves. Be on the lookout for potential gravel or other unstable road conditions. Be careful when crossing railroad tracks because the paint can be slippery – the same goes for the white lines at stoplights.

One of the biggest dangers to a rider is getting on your bike in the wrong state of mind. Riding angry, drowsy or distracted can be a recipe for disaster. Remember, when you're on a motorcycle you are ultimately the only one on the road looking out for you. If your mind and emotions are anywhere other than the road ahead, you are susceptible to making rookie mistakes that can end in a crash, injuries or worse.

# District Educators

Members,

It is that time to winterize the motorcycle; we were lucky in Michigan this year to have some beautiful days to ride in November.

By the time we can ride that motorcycle again in April, so many things can happen if our precious beast of burden is not winterized. Batteries can become dead or frozen and tires can crack or become flat. The cooling system, oil system, and the fuel system may all have developed deposits. An ounce of prevention is the best way to go.

Top off the tank with fresh gas, and put fuel stabilizer in. Start the motorcycle and let the stabilizer cycle through. Check the air pressure in the tires. Check the air filter and clean or replace it. Changing the oil and oil filter now or first thing in the spring each have advantages, so we'll leave the choice up to you. Just don't be in such a hurry when the weather does warm up and neglect to do it at all.

Washing and waxing will definitely protect it from moisture and you will be able to start off a new riding season with what looks like a brand new bike in the sunshine! Leather protectant certainly doesn't hurt. If you know that your storage area is prone to critter visits, close off any openings, and cover it up tightly. The battery is another personal choice; a battery tender may be used but removing the battery and keeping it in a cool, dry space is preferred by some.

While looking at some websites regarding motorcycle safety this month, we found some Michigan motorcyclist crash data from an organization called SMARTER (Skilled Motorcyclist Association Responsible, Trained & Educated Riders). They compiled some data that show that the weakening of the motorcycle helmet law in Michigan in 2012 did not result in an increase in motorcycle registrations. It did show an increase of 18.18% in the average number of fatalities per year in these past eight and a half years compared to the nine years prior to the change in law. There has been a reduction in crashes, but that reduction has not resulted in a reduction in fatalities. Actually, there has been a steady increase in fatalities for nearly three decades.

Helmet use is 80% or higher when an all-rider motorcycle helmet law is in effect, and when the law is repealed or weakened, the use drops to 50% or lower. The data they compiled show that the main factors correlated with fatal crashes include higher speed, striking a solid object or a vehicle, and not wearing a helmet. As a matter of fact, un-helmeted riders who crash die at a rate approximately double that of riders who are wearing a helmet. Ask Santa for a new helmet is what we gathered for this research, and promise to wear it every time!

Please share what your chapter/family does to help pass the time and have more FUN!!



**DISTRICT COUPLE OF THE YEAR Requirements** • Couples must consist of one male and one female. • Both male and female must hold Individual or Family Membership in GWR-RA. • Membership must be valid through the end of the term of the Couple of the Year position they are seeking. • An eligible Couple must be a current Chapter Couple of the Year if being considered for District. • The Couple, or either one of its partners, cannot be a past National or International Couple of the Year. • All Districts will provide or create an annual opportunity (District rally or special meeting) for any interested chapter couples throughout their District to participate in the District Couple of the Year Selection Process. Notification of this event must be communicated to each chapter to allow them time and opportunity to advise their respective couples. • The Selection Process should be adhered to even if there is only one Couple participating in the process. Failure to follow the guidelines for the selection as noted above will result in the chosen Couple being ineligible for the International Couple of the Year Selection. • District Couples do have the option of staying as District Couple for the course of their term and thereby choosing NOT to move forward to the International Couple of the Year Selection Process.

Couples interested in pursuing District Couple of the Year selection are asked to submit a six-page Resume, undergo an interview process with the selection judges, make a five-minute on-stage presentation and answer one or two questions at the selection event. The District presentation event is open to the Members and is held at a District rally or event. The selection process is judged on GWRRA commitment and involvement as reflected in the Resume (30%), interview (21%), oral presentation (28%), moderator's question (15%), and appearance (6%).

At the District level a minimum of 4 judges should be selected. The District Couple of the Year becomes a member of the District TEAM and should always be recognized at all District functions. Being named District Couple of the Year is an honor given to a Couple who has demonstrated active participation in their District.

Don't feel pressured to do the same or more than the couple ahead of you. As a district couple of the year, you should only do what you can do within your means of time, money and family time. It is always fun and you find yourself doing more as the fun increases. Go out and enjoy your honor and have fun!!
