The hot and the cold,

We experienced both of these this past weekend, from 95 degrees Thursday to 55 degrees in the early morning hours of Sunday. The low Thursday night was 84, so we had both fans going in the tent and all the panels open. The low Saturday night was 58, so we closed everything up and had the heater going and one sleeping bag over us. So please check the weather and plan for it when you are out on the motorcycle. Hopefully you have taken the Riding in the Heat and the Riding in the Cold seminars in the past for great suggestions!



For those of you who still wish to take classes, and can't make it to SSM on August 13th, Ohio is planning a Trailer Rider Course for later in the year, but only if they have enough interest. They have completed their two weekends in two locations of Rider Courses for the year. Indiana has completed their two classes in one location.

In 2022, we are only able to hold six classes in three locations due to only one two wheel bike registered and three trikes registered. Grayling, just one example, charges us for the use of their classrooms at \$25 each for a half day. They also charge custodial rates on Saturday of \$35 per hour, which in the past, they have only charged us \$70 for the opening of the building and the closing of the building. Instructors are needed to be at the ranges on the afternoon/evening before to paint the ranges so a night's stay is reimbursed out of MI funds, and are reimbursed at .30 a mile.

Neither we nor National Office wants us to charge more than \$35 per motorcycle, but this is a short explanation of where the money goes and how important Jan and Ron Smith have been in keeping Rider Courses and MFA seminars funded.

In the November 2021 Rider Education article in the Michigan newsletter, we showed a map of Michigan with the 2022 Rider Course locations marked in red so that you could compare it to other states' Rider Course location(s). That article also explained that two classrooms are required, one for ARC and one for TRC, and that the ARC range must be 140 x 240 feet and the TRC range must be 160 x 240 feet with no obstacles, no lampposts, no concrete pylons, etc.

During the Ohio Buckeye Rally's Masters Breakfast on June 18th, we had the opportunity to ask some questions due to two sets of National Rider Education Assistants being available. Robert and Angela Williams are not only the District Educators for Ohio but are also GWRRA Rider Education Assistants. Chuck and Melanie Geggie were in attendance also, and are GWRRA Rider Education Assistants.

Questions we asked: There will be no backdating of any levels forms to attain a level that was "missed". Both classroom and range sessions must be attended to achieve an attendance card and for it to be entered into the RE database. TRC range portion has been revised and will be tested at Wing Ding, they believed. It will be similar to the revised ARC range portion in condensing some exercises, thus making range painting easier and quicker.

The Levels Program was reviewed again by Robert Williams and his focus was that each of us at the breakfast as Master Tour Riders and Master Tour Co-Riders were very much needed to promote the levels program in our home chapters. We have been reviewing each member's record that registers for Rider Courses, prepping the form, and giving it to the member at the course for updates/sign ups. I also had a dozen updates and sign-up forms prepped before Wingless Weekend and caught up with those members and if not, their Chapter Directors. It takes a village for the Rider Level program to succeed.

MEDIC FIRST AID / CPR / AED

Have you ever watched a movie more than once? How about a TV show rerun? Personally, I watch two MASH episodes every week night that I'm home! They never get old. Just because you've seen a show once, does that mean you'll never watch it again? I'm not talking about something horrible that isn't worth watching, I'm talking about something that held your interest for any number of reasons. When you're watching that movie or TV show a second, third or hundredth time, do you ever pick up on some little thing that you had previously missed or maybe had just forgotten that it happened? I do, and I'm thinking you probably do, too.

Well, transition that thinking over to taking your Medic First Aid/AED/CPR class every two years. You've been there, done that, watched that, did the CPR thing, etc. Why take part of a day and take it again? But maybe, just maybe, you did miss something that first time. Or you forgot that aspect of helping a victim the second time. Maybe the training has been updated or methods changed since you last participated.

I want to encourage you to continue taking the MFA/AED/CPR class when you're due. It not only keeps your levels current, but keeps your mind current. Not sure if you are due? It's easy to check. Then click on Rider Education. Then click on MY R.E. Information. You will then be asked to enter your Member Login. Your Username is your Membership number. Your Password is the Numbers in your Address + your Membership Expiration Date. Note: if your expiration date only has 3 numbers (3/25) you need to add the 0 in front (03/25) Then click submit. You should be seeing Member Family Listing. Click on View to see all of your information including expiration dates of classes taken. This can be useful in many ways.



Once again, as of this writing, there are no classes scheduled. It is a very busy time of year for all of us, which makes it difficult to plan and hold a class. But not impossible! Or, if you're wanting to plan ahead for the non-riding months, schedule ahead! If your

Chapter is needing/wanting a class, please fill out the request form and send it to Dennis. This is where having the three dates that we ask for will be really important, so that we can hopefully have one of our three instructors available. For myself, there are some Tuesdays or Thursdays during the summer that I could do a class if that would work better for you than a Saturday.

Remember we're back to a minimum 6 per class, maximum 12, for one instructor. Two are needed for a class of 13-24. Still only \$25 per person.

MOTORIST AWARENESS

Being an Aware Motorist never ends. Being an Aware Motorist that continues to share information with others, no matter what they drive, never ends. Being an Aware Motorist is everyone's responsibility, not just the people holding the title in your Chapter or District. Our goal is to keep everyone safe on the road. Everyone wants to come home to their families.

Sharing information with other drivers and passengers is so much more than yelling at them from the privacy of your ride when you see them doing something stupid and dangerous on the road! That helps no one and can be dangerous in itself. Road rage is a huge factor in our lives today. You may think that yelling at them for not using their turn signal, or for cutting you off, or for tailgating you, or for being on their phones, or for the home owner that's mowing his grass into the road, you may think that's not road rage, that's just screaming for them to use common sense! But sadly, that's how it can start. We're not saying it will cause complete road rage where people end up hurt or even killed, but it can be a factor as you never know the other person's state of mind or how they will react. Safety for everyone must be the main factor in actions and reactions.

So you may never know if what that other driver did was a one-time incident (come on, we've all made those mistakes at one time or another, admit it!), or, if they just don't realize that what they did was so dangerous to others, especially those of us riding. That's where sharing information about Motorist Awareness comes in for everyone.

Sharing is educating. Sometimes that happens through one-on-one conversations with friends, family, or those you're meeting for the first time. These conversations can begin purposefully or innocently. Doesn't matter how, just that they happen. You can be the someone who shares and educates. Wear your MA orange wrist band as a conversation starter. Don't have one yet? Let me know and either Earl or I will get you one.

You can be the one who talks with your children or grandchildren about watching out for motorcycles and letting Mom or Dad know. Teach them to make it a game now while they're young and it'll be ingrained in their minds as teens learning to drive. That will make them an Aware Motorist for life. Don't try and tell me that you don't think the phrase "slug bug" or "punch bug" or whatever you called a Volkswagen when you see one on the road still today. Maybe not out loud, but you think it! Or some other vehicle game you played in the car as a kid to ward off the boredom of the back seat or to best your

siblings in the game. It all comes down to training the eyes to see and the mind to recognize motorcycles on the road. You teach them other important safety lessons, don't neglect this important area.

Sometimes sharing the information is done in a group setting. At a Chapter gathering, or a Rally, how about at a school, a church, a VFW, or any other organizations that you are either a part of, or know someone who can get you in. If you would like one of us, which includes Earl and Bobbi, to help share with the group, let us know.

(Again, sadly the Motorist Awareness videos still can not be shown at this time.)

How about getting permission to set up outside a store, or at a park or rest area, somewhere you can hand out the free brochures available to you. We're setting up our Motorist Awareness canopy in mid July at the local Hot Air Jubilee in Jackson. Think about the different opportunities in your area and start by getting permission, setting a date, lining up some others to help, and let us know about it! We want to support your endeavors in Motorist Awareness. We can't do that if we aren't aware of it.

We'd like to thank Earl and Bobbi Gerard, our awesome Assistants, and who also happen to be our amazing Northeast Territory Couple of the Year, for all they do in promoting Motorist Awareness throughout GWRRA. They have great ideas to share with you, so feel free to talk with them, too. We'd also like to thank all of the Chapter Motorist Awareness persons who help promote safe driving and help to educate people. Remember that brochures to pass out to people are free from the National site, including free shipping. Please take advantage of this awesome resource.


